REMINDERS

1. Your signed HSL Membership Form must be submitted, your HSL dues must be paid, and your registration fees for this tournament must be paid before your school can participate.
2. The **original source** for pieces performed in the categories of Humorous, Dramatic, Duo and Program Oral Interpretation must be available to the Tournament Director in case of protest.
3. Reuse Rule: A student who has qualified for the State Forensic Championships at a previous tournament MAY use his/her winning material again.
4. All extemporaneous speaking competitors must report to the prep room 30 minutes before each round. We will strictly adhere to the draw times, and no extra time will be given to tardy competitors. Extemp speakers may not talk and/or collaborate during their preparation time and must remain in the prep room until dismissed by the chairperson. Failure to follow these rules may result in disqualification from the tournament.
5. It is the responsibility of the first speaker(s) in the round to write the codes in the correct speaking order on the board in the classroom. ALL COMPETITORS, however, must check the posting sheets to ensure accuracy. The last speaker should erase the boards. Any competitor who performs in the wrong room will be given the lowest rankings in the round.
6. We will be using two (2) judges in every room for the preliminary rounds, three (3) judges in finals. Students must wait outside of the room until at least one judge is present and should not begin the round until ALL judges are present.
7. Rounds should begin as scheduled, even if there is no timekeeper. Competitors should time keep for each other.

8. Observers are allowed and encouraged to watch. Please be supportive of one another.
9. Do not leave valuables unattended.
10. **Absolutely no food or drink other than capped water bottles is allowed in the classrooms. Do not use a trashcan in any classroom.**
11. The procedures for state qualification at the All O'ahu District Speech Tournament differs from previous speech qualifying tournaments. *Finalists will be chosen from the top ranked students who have not yet qualified for the state tournament in that category.*
12. Certificates are given to all final round participants. Medals will be awarded to state qualifiers. No team sweepstakes trophy will be awarded at this tournament.
13. Qualifying numbers are based on the actual number of participants on the day of the tournament and thus subject to change.
