

HSL TOURNAMENT #6

- WHAT:** SPEECH AND DEBATE STATE QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT
- WHERE:** **Parker School** (65-1224 Lindsey Rd., Kamuela, HI 96743)
- WHEN:** Friday & Saturday, January 17-18, 2020
- ENTRY DEADLINE:** Saturday, December 21, 2020 **for entries and judges**
Friday, January 10 2020 **for orations, interp. and oratory/informative speaking verification forms**
- PARTICIPATION:** Open to all HSL member schools that have paid their HSL membership dues and submitted their signed membership form.

EVENTS AND DEBATE

1. **STORYTELLING (ST):** No manuscripts may be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the title and author of the selection. Selections must be from published sources. Students are encouraged to use the floor space. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 8 minutes.
2. **PROGRAM ORAL INTERPRETATION (POI):** Manuscripts *must* be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the titles and authors of each selection. Selections must be from published sources and be chosen from at least two genres: prose, poetry, drama. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 10 minutes.
3. **HUMOROUS (HI), DRAMATIC (DI) and DUO (DUO) INTERPRETATION:** Manuscripts cannot be used. Presentations must be prefaced by an introduction that includes the title and author of the selection. Selections must be from published sources. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 10 minutes.
4. **ORIGINAL ORATORY (OO) and INFORMATIVE SPEAKING (INF):** Manuscripts cannot be used; presentations must come exclusively from memory. Manuscripts must be the original work of the student and copies of orations must be submitted to the Tournament Director by the deadline. No more than 150 words of the oration or speech may be direct quotations from any other source. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 10 minutes.
5. **IMPROMPTU SPEAKING (IS):** Topics include quotations, sayings, one-word items, media personalities, song titles, etc. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. **PREPARATION TIME:** 5 minutes. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 5 minutes.
6. **U.S. EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEAKING (USX):** Topics will cover U.S. foreign policy and U.S. domestic issues. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. **PREPARATION TIME:** 30 minutes. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 7 minutes.
7. **INTERNATIONAL EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEAKING (IX):** Topics will cover foreign policies and actions of many countries, including the United States. Notes are NOT permitted during the delivery of the speech. **PREPARATION TIME:** 30 minutes. **MAXIMUM TIME:** 7 minutes.
8. **PUBLIC FORUM DEBATE (BEGINNING and ADVANCED): NSDA 2020 January PFD Topic**—“Resolved: The United States should end its economic sanctions against Venezuela.”
9. **LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE (NOVICE and CHAMPIONSHIP): NSDA 2019 November/December Topic**—“Resolved: The United States ought to eliminate subsidies for fossil fuels.”
10. **POLICY DEBATE (JUNIOR VARSITY and VARSITY): NSDA 2019-2020 Topic**—“Resolved: *The United States federal government should substantially reduce Direct Commercial Sales and/or Foreign Military Sales of arms from the United States.*”

REGISTRATION

Registration must be processed using <https://www.tabroom.com>. You can access the Tabroom website by using our official League website <http://www.hawaiispeechleague.org>.

VERIFICATION FORMS

The interpretation verification form, oratory/informative speaking verification form(s), and all orations must be received by the deadline above. Please upload these documents to <https://www.tabroom.com>. Original sources for each selection in POI, HI, DI, and DUO must be brought to the tournament in case of challenge.

REUSE RULE

Competitors who qualify for the State Forensic Championship may NOT use their winning selection or oration again until the District and/or State Forensic Championship.

LIMITS

Each school may register a maximum of eighteen (18) entries in speech and eighteen (18) entries in debate. **DOUBLE ENTRIES ARE NOT ALLOWED.**

FEES

\$12.00 per participant. As a reminder, Duo Interp, Public Forum Debate, and Policy Debate entries must be paid according to the number of participants, not the number of entries.

JUDGES

Schools must provide one (1) judge for every Policy team, one (1) judge for every two (2) LD debaters, one (1) judge for every two (2) Public Forum teams, and one (1) judge for every three (3) speech entries. Schools that do not provide their required number of judges may have entries withdrawn from the tournament. We are grateful for any additional judges you can provide. Please inform your judges to be at Parker School for the orientation 30 minutes before their first round.
